WE HAVE AN ELAC AT JAMES RUTTER BECAUSE 2016 Language Census


 By law we have to because whenever 21 or more English Learners are enrolled at a school site, the site must have a functioning ELAC on programs and service for English Learners.




English Language Acquisition Status





To reclassify and no longer be considered an English Learner these students

- Scored proficient or above grade level in English on the California State Test last Spring.
- Scored Early Advanced or Advanced in most of the ELAPC (English Language Proficiency Assessments for California) testing sections reading, writing, listening, speaking
- Had a C+ or higher in their English class last year
- These students will be monitored for four years to make sure they are still successful in their classes.



WHAT IS AN EL STUDENT?

- Does anyone know? Turn and talk please.
- An EL student is an English Learner—a student who speaks an additional language who is learning English to become proficient.
- Proficient meaning, to read, write, speak, and listen in English at grade level.



HOW DID MY CHILD GET CATEGORIZED AS AN EL STUDENT?

- Home Language Survey
- Every year your child takes the CELDT test. It tests them in reading, writing, speaking, and listening in English.
- Once your child is reclassified, they are no longer considered an English Learner. They are still monitored by the district and site to make sure they are doing well in classes, but they do not have to take English Learner classes.
- All English Learner Students are provided with classes that support them in learning English.
- Many students at James Rutter Middle School may have lived in the United States their whole lives, but they communicate in a language other than English at home
